At the end of the meeting, members voted on best finds for the month. The treasure hunting find went to Toby Shedd and the prospecting find went to EB Shedd.

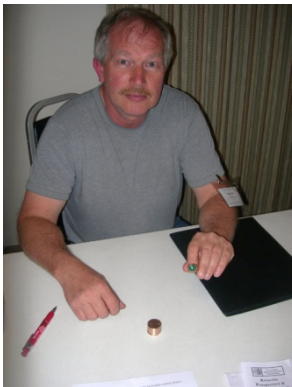

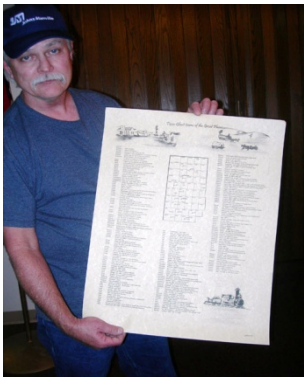
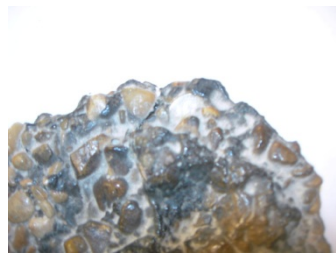
At 9:30 The meeting was adjourned.

Letting the detector tell you when you have found a small, shallow target

For anyone unfamiliar with the concept of determining small shallow target versus bigger deeper target it is easy to take advantage of the Inverse Squares Law. Many times you'll hear John L mention to "pick up the detector's coil and you hear it better". That is this concept explained. Simply put, the detector signal strength falls off to the square of the change in distance between the loop and the target. The signal strength of a target at 1" will be 1/25 as the strength at 5" and 1/100 of the strength at 10". When hunting deeper targets you have to slow down. What we hear in our headphones is not really a linear representation of that signal strength. The detector audio is simply saturated to the maximum with the target at 1" and maybe up to 5" or more so it is at a constant maximum volume. But once the target reaches 10", the volume is no longer in saturation so the sound we hear is greatly reduced in volume. (We'll ignore human hearing being logarithmic for this example and spillover type target signal boosting circuitry here). A very small target close to the surface will give the equivalent signal strength of say a penny at 5". But the detector volume is in saturation so we hear a loud equivalent signal volume. But if we raise the loop a little increasing the distance between the target and the loop, the Inverse Square Law tells us that for that small change in distance by raising the loop, the target signal strength drops off dramatically for the small close target and the signal audio loudness comes out of saturation and drops off rapidly for the small target to where perhaps a movement of the loop by only 1" will make the target sound disappear completely. Whereas for the deeper penny, the same change in distance only diminishes the signal volume slightly. This is a great way to not dig small shot or BBs unless you just want to ;)
