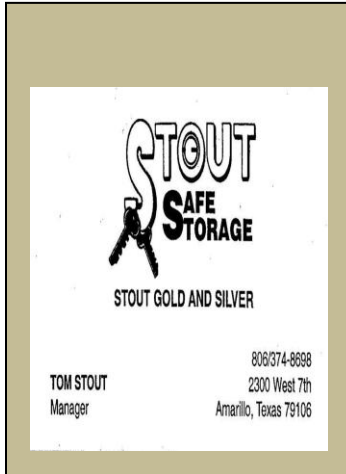

GOLD DEPOSITS

Gold occurs in two types of deposits: Lode and Placer (pronounced plasser).

Lode deposits consist of ore minerals in veins or series of veins or disseminated in rock. These deposits require blasting, milling or chemical treatment to recover the gold.

When a lode deposit weather and erodes, gold and other minerals that resist weathering remain. Some of these minerals are called "heavy minerals" because a given volume weighs more than the same volume of most other minerals. Many heavy minerals are black and make up what are commonly referred to as "Black Sands".

When the weathered material is transported in a stream, heavy minerals including gold settle into crevices and any other depressions in the streambed and form placer deposits. Gold in the sand and gravel in the streambed can be recovered by panning, among other means.
